Southern CT songwriters Ron Anthony and Denny Collin will win you over with their first song and take you along on a wonderful musical ride. Decades of singing, writing and playing acoustic & bass guitars allow these artists to cook up marvelous grooves with graceful authority while singing with sure expression. Ron has opened shows for Bonnie Raitt, John Fahey and Michael Bolton! Recently, Ron won Best Solo Blues Artist hosted by The CT Blues Society. Ron and Denny will perform songs from Ron's Live At Slate's and Berkshire Serenade CDs.

Taking the stage to open tonight's show, Plainville's **Bill Morrell** who stands nearly 6 1/2 ft tall under his cowboy hat, will show that he's got more to offer than classic country songs. The fact that this rich-voiced, left-handed guitarist plays a 7-string Roger McGuinn model Martin guitar is a clue that he's been influenced by not only Johnny Cash, Merle Haggard, Hank Williams and Hank Snow, but also by Waylon & Willie, CSNY, George Harrison and The Byrds.

FRIDAY, October 19 RAMBLIN' JACK ELLIOTT 7:30 pm \$30 Advance / \$35 Door



Don't miss this rare chance to see this living legend and King of all Troubadours in our intimate listening room. Seemingly ageless, five-time Grammy Nominee and national treasure RAMBLIN' JACK ELLIOTT recently performed a string of shows out West with the incomparable John Prine. Cited as a major influence by Bruce Springsteen, Jackson Browne, Keith Richards, Dave Alvin, Bob Weir. Guy Clark, Bob Dylan, Joan Baez, Tom Russell and Doc Watson, Jack was presented with The Presidential Medal of the Arts by Bill Clinton at The White House. Elliott won the Best Traditional Folk Grammy for his '95 release SOUTH COAST and the Best Traditional Blues Grammy for his 2008 album A STRANGER HERE. Through his scores of albums, Jack has illuminated the works of Woody Guthrie, Tim Hardin, Leadbelly, Jesse Fuller. Lillian Bos Ross. Rev. Garv Davis, A.P.Carter, Son House and Blind Lemon Jefferson. He has championed hundreds of folk ballads, blues and cowboy songs that

may have been lost without his renditions. Listen to this master storyteller, guitarist and performer of many of America's most profound songs. Jack's set list may include "Pastures of Plenty", "South Coast", "Don't Think Twice", "If I We're a Carpenter", "San Francisco Bay Blues" and "Diamond Joe."

Coming of age during the 60's folk music surge, Stan Sullivan chose, as he does today, songwriter-guitarists and roots music artists as role models. Starting guitar in 1961 and attending Newport Folk Fest '65 and Woodstock '69 were giant inspirational steps. They inspired him to create his own songs, guitar instrumentals and blues and to put his stamp on classic and strong cover songs. Work and inspiration put him on bills with role models Dave Van Ronk, Rory Block, Richard Thompson, John Hammond, Bill Morrissey, Janis Ian, Tim O'Brien and Ronnie Earl & the Broadcasters. Continuing his education by attending Richard Thompson's Frets & Refrains Music Camp and competing in guitar contests in the U.S. and Canada, he also has earned finalist awards at The Walnut Valley

Festival, KS and Tucson Folk Festival for songwriting. Tonight Stan has many new songs and tunes to perform in addition to selections from his CDs The Right Road and Do You Like The Rain? Stan's sets will include his renditions of "Killing The Blues", "Fields of Gold", "Dimming of the Day" and Summertime". Performing Guests will include Donna Martin on harmony vocals, Tim Quinn in harmonica and WWUH 91.3 Celtic Airs host Christine on flutes and pennywhistle.

The Toronto Fingerstyle Guitar Association referred to Stephen Bennett as "The Jedi Master of Fingerstyle Guitar." We say he's the most complete acoustic steel-string guitarist we have heard or hosted. His artistry is informed by an extensive musical background with formal studies of piano, clarinet and classical guitar. A guitar festival unto himself, he plays the majestic harp guitar plus 6-string, 12-string, National Steel and baritone guitars. A champion of fine melodies, great grooves and confident improvisation, he has shared the stage and toured with Tommy Emmanuel, Andy McKee, Harvey Reid, Tim Thompson, Pat Donohue and Pete Huttlinger. Stephen's impressive 30 album discography showcases his repertoire of stellar originals, Celtic, folk and roots gems, classical and jazz anthems, movie soundtrack themes and hot acoustic renditions of rock and pop hits. Stephen's shows are a joy to attend as he masterfully interprets tunes such as The Who's "Behind Blue Eyes, The Beatles' "All You Need Is Love," Dvorak's "Going Home" and the traditional "Star Of The County Down." His own compositions, "Balcony Boogie," "The Eye of God," "Atlanta Blues," and "Perestroika" raise the bar on contemporary guitar playing.
